THREAT PROCEDURES CHECKLIST

This quick reference checklist is designed to help employees and decision makers respond to a threat, including bomb threat in an orderly and controlled manner with the first responders and other stakeholders.

Most threats are received by phone. Threats are serious until proven otherwise. Act quickly but remain calm and obtain information with the checklist on the back of this flyer.

Phone Calls

- 1. Remain calm. Keep the caller on the line for as long as possible. DO NOT HANG UP, even if the caller does.
- 2. Listen carefully. Be polite and show interest.
- 3. Try to keep the caller talking to learn more information.
- 4. If possible, write a note to a colleague to contact 911 or, as soon as the caller hangs up, immediately notify them yourself.
- 5. If your phone has a display, copy the number and/or letters on the window display.
- 6. Complete the Threat Checklist immediately. Write down as much detail as you can remember. Try to use their exact words.
- 7. Immediately upon termination of the call, DO NOT HANG UP, but from a different phone, contact authorities immediately with information and await instructions.

Handwritten Note

- 1. Contact 911.
- 2. Handle the note as minimally as possible.

Email

- 1. Contact 911.
- 2. Do not delete the message.

Social Media

- 1. Contact 911.
- 2. Do not turn off or log out of the account.
- 3. Leave the message open on the device.
- 4. Take a screenshot or copy the message.

Suspicious Package

- 1. Signs of a suspicious package include:
- No return address
- Excessive postage
- Stains
- Strange odor
- Strange sounds
- Unexpected delivery
- 2. Contact 911

DO NOT

- Use two-way radios or cellular phone. Radio signals have the potential to detonate a bomb.
- Touch or move a suspicious package

- Poorly written
 - Misspelled words
 - Incorrect titles
 - Foreign postage
 - Restrictive notes
