RECOGNITIONS

Class of 2019 was the largest graduating class with 905 earning credentials at WNC.

The WNC Foundation raised 130K dollars at our Reach for the Stars event and had almost 400 people in attendance.







2010 - 2019







Enrollment Status

36% are full-time & they have a 29% graduation rate 64% are part-time & they have a 12% graduation rate

Gender

58% are female with a 33% graduation rate 42% are male with a 25% graduation rate

STUDENTS BY EDUCATIONAL GOAL FALL - 2018

University Transfer Students – 1,821 Total (55%) 50% are full-time 50% are part-time

Workforce Students – 893 Total (27%) 27% are full-time 73% are part-time

Non-Degree Seeking Students – 613 Total (18%) 6% are full-time 94% are part-time This group is up 25% since fall of 2017


PERCENTAGE OF CREDIT HOURS TAUGHT

In 2018-19, 83% of the students in classes taught by full-time faculty passed their classes while 82% of those in classes taught by part-time faculty passed. 60% of part-time faculty teach in Liberal Arts while 40% teach Workforce education classes.

ONLINE EDUCATION

52% of our student body are enrolled in at least one online course

Online education makes up 34% of our full-time equivalent (FTE)

Online education is up 13% overall from 2017

Students enrolled in only online education has increased by 22%

Approximately 1/3 of all students are 100% online, but of those students taking all online courses 19% of the credit hours are dropped or withdrawn before end of term
