Heather talked about her new club starter kit and that Katrina's club packet is now complete. Heather brought up that the Social work club is interested in holding IAV meetings with Fallon during future meetings. Ashley talked about the annual Nevada promise event on November 7th for 600 high school students. She requests up to \$5000 from ASWN to fund this event. Heather talked about the importance of the Nevada promise event, specifically transportation for students. She also brought up the idea that going over budget reports and approving a budget for the event can be lowered to a more appropriate amount.

 Ashley asked the ASWN to hold a table at the Nevada Promise event. Heather brought up that the WNC Soccer club's club starter kit packet is complete and now ready to be chartered. Heather brought up that the Nerd Herd club, a homeschool exclusive club's starter kit packet is complete and now ready to
 be chartered. Benjamin asked how the rest of ASWN Carson and Fallon are doing in their classes. Diana brought up a new club wishing to start on Fallon campus, a board game club.

Agenda Topic 5	Approval for up to \$500 to be spent by ASWN Fallon for October events

Summary of Discussion	ASWN Fallon will hold 3 Halloween events in the month of October, all adding up to approximately \$450.

Comments/Information	 Diana answered Heather's question of what the funds will be spent on during their pumpkin gram event. The funds will go towards small pumpkins with candy bags and other items (pumpkin grams) to be sold for \$10 to both students and nonstudents. The goal is to sell 50 pumpkin grams. Each pumpkin gram would cost \$5 to make. \$105 would create 50 pumpkin grams, making an \$8 profit per item. The Trunk or Treat event would cost \$200 in candy. All 3 events should cost no more than \$500. Delivery to pumpkin grams buyers would be restricted to 5 miles within the Fallon area.

Summary of Discussion	A smaller event will be put on by ASWN for 10-31-19 due to lack of assurance that a very expensive event will be successful.
Assignments/Potential Agenda Items	
Comments/Information	 Benjamin talked about the amount of \$2300 going towards buying the structure, snacks, water, and candy for the haunted house on 10-31-19. Diana proposed the Haunted house cost \$15 for students with the discount of \$5 with a food donation. Gabrielle inquired that if not all \$5000 is spent, the rest will go back into the ASWN general account. Desirae and Heather inquired that the specifics of \$5000 being approved is very critical in the sense that any spending can be up to that amount, and having a predetermined budget does not account for unforeseen spending. Heather announced that ASWN's spending should be well thought out for future events and expenditures. All ASWN spending is being closely watched by the budget committee, and that spending in the 2019-2020 year will highly affect the future fiscal year. Heather announced that the ASWN would no longer be undertaking future events without preparations well in advance. Gabrielle inquired that with no tangible data for past Haunted Houses, sign-up sheets, or concrete budget, she does not support the approval for the \$5000 to be spent. Desirae and Katrina agreed with Gabrielle that with the lack of information and data for the Haunted house, a smaller event should be considered. (A SHORT RECESS WAS CONDUCTED) Addison inquired that the \$5000 would be for all October events, including both the Haunted House and Blood drive. Heather commented that all funds approved for the month of October will be spent on events during the month of October, not just one event. Diana had the idea to hold a smaller event free to students and the public. Heather had the idea to lower the budget to a more appropriate amount for the October events. Gabrielle commented that the next agenda would contain the item of giving the counseling department \$5000 for a Nevada Promise event, and this would be a significant amount from ASWN's budget to consider giving out.<!--</th-->
