Comments/Information	 Heather announced that the Men's and Women's Leadership Summits have been combined. The website, and all flyers have been updated. Heather would like the ASWN to further promote the event. The cap of the event will be set at 125 students. Ben stated that the Leadership summit will most likely postpone the ASWN meeting on November 22nd. Gabrielle stated that if a meeting will happen, the items would need to be input 3 days prior to the meeting. Heather announced that a student named Jennifer Sanchez is interested in the role of Secretary of the ASWN.

 Desirae stated that a few students on Fallon campus are interested in applying for ASWN, and questions how they co apply. Heather answered this by stating that the new ASWN application could be sent to Fallon ASWN to be filled out by student in question. Heather stated that she wishes for the ASWN Carson and F to be balanced in terms of Senators, Fallon has a smaller student population, and doesn't necessarily require as many Senators as Carson ASWN. Ben also stated that, since most of the committees meet only once a month, the same member would find it beneficial to stay on that same committee throughout the school year. Comments/Information	 Heather confirmed that the role of a club liaison is reporting during the club reports item of an ASWN meeting any information they have gathered from their assigned club meeting. Ben stated that any member of ASWN can also be a member of a club, as long as they do not play an active role in the club, while also being their liaison. An unbiased opinion is necessary with communicating in clubs. Desirae also confirmed that the ASWN member who chooses to liaison for a club can inform that club in question about how to function in contrast to how the ASWN functions. Heather stated that members of the ASWN, in terms of participating in a club, should not take on a club directing role, but rather report every week any information the club would like to convey. Heather stated that the liaison doesn't explicitly need to attend club meetings, but should, in some fashion, check in with their club accordingly. Gabrielle agreed that this weekly check in could be an email. Gabrielle stated that clubs should also be liable to communicate with the ASWN, and not only the ASWN reaching out to clubs. Heather stated that, if a member of the ASWN wishes to liaison for a club, that does not mean they cannot play an active role in that club.

Comments/Information	 Heather commended all college faculty and students for their participation in the Nevada Day parade. An estimated 80-90 individuals participated. Heather exclaimed how fun the parade was for many. Heather commended the turnout of Churros with the Chancellor presentation, which was so large it was nearly overwhelming. Gabrielle participated well in the presentation, and asked many questions about budgetary information. Heather stated that the Chancellor search for next year is underway. Heather announced that this count year is down 4%, which equates to about \$800,000-\$1,500,000 as a budgetary cut. Heather explained the importance of budgeting the college in a

- Heather stated that, Susan Trist, Vincent Solis, and Darla dodge will be attending an ASWN meeting shortly, and would like to be updated on any plans the ASWN is going through. It is not ideal to have more than one guest at any given meeting, due to the amount of time taken during their item(s).
- Heather stated that speaking to students in regards to events, reports, and overall representing the ASWN should be very well thought out, and not misrepresent the student body, no paraphrasing or using a small amount of students to represent the entire college's opinion. Gabrielle agreed with this, stating that her viewpoints during the Churro with a Chancellor event did not represent the student body, but with greater data collection, the ASWN can compile better results on any topic thereof.
- Heather gave an example of how misrepresentation of a topic, event, or general viewpoint can change how the college administration will judge the ASWN. An ASWN member should not divulge their personal opinion as the viewpoint of other students. With nearly 4,000 students enrolled at WNC, utilizing the different committees would be beneficial to gaining and exchanging data between the different departments of the college. Michael gave an example of the benefits of the bookstore, and gathering data from students.
- Heather stated that the assignment of vacuuming, microwave and Brita station cleaning, and general office cleaning needs to be scheduled.
- Heather announced that 6 new Brita station filters need to be voted on for purchase.
- Heather requires the shirt sizes for the ASWN to wear to committees, events, and general public appearances.
