Comments/Information	Mandy Billings: Fall 2019 WNC Student Needs Survey  Summary of Results:  3601 students took the survey.  Partial Response:  - 1049/3601 (29%).  Complete Response:  - 905/3601 (25%).  Secure Housing:  - 23% of students are house insecure during the last twelve months. Meaning they had trouble paying rent, bills or are homeless (7%).  Food:  - 38% of students are food insecure in the last 30 days. This means that they do not have adequate, safe food. About 28% were hungry in the last 30 days and 36% of students with children were food insecure and/or hungry (9%).  - School Expenses and other:  - 51% of students are employed, 40% work full-time.  - 30% borrow money (in the past 12 months).  -Employment: 41%  -Schoolarships and Grants: 34% without Pell -Pell Grant: 33%  -Help from family/friends: 27%  - Most vulnerable student populations:  - LGBTQ+  - Former Foster Care  - Pell Grant recipients  - Transportation:  - Both transportation and internet access are not significant barriers to WNC students.  - 87% of students have some sort of transportation.  - 98% have access to internet off-campus.  Donnell joins the meeting at 3:36 P.M.  ASWN is interested in running a food pantry at WNC due to the fact that a big percentage of students are food insecure (38%) and hungry (28%).  - Mandy Billings talks to ASWN members and helps guide them on how to run a campus food pantry.
