WNC Foundation Mission

WNC Foundation develops resources in support of Western Nevada College by creating community partnerships, encouraging philanthropy and strengthening the relationships between the college and communities it serves.

WNC Foundation Pledge

The WNC Foundation is committed to ensuring donors can invest in students, programs and facilities with confidence and ease. WNC Foundation performs due diligence of fund management, maintains compliance with IRS guidelines and responds rapidly to all inquiries. Investments through the WNC Foundation help to create opportunities – chief among them, employment. Investments support students as they earn an education and obtain jobs, allowing them to support their families, build their careers and contribute back to their community.

WNC Foundation Awards & Recognition

On November 7, 2019, WNC Foundation received the Boundary Peak Exceptional Nonprofit Award through the Northern Nevada Development Authority's Pioneer Awards. WNC Foundation was chosen for the award for extraordinary growth in funding streams from 2016-2019, active board involvement, presence in the community, and consistent support of workforce development initiatives.

Gift Report

A total of \$1,469,963 in cash gifts were raised from individuals, corporations and foundations for the year ending June 30, 2020 (FY20). An additional \$55,531 of in-kind gifts were raised including an Ambulance donated by Metro West Ambulance to help support WNC's new Paramedicine program. The donated vehicle is valued at over \$7,500.

*Additionally, WNC Foundation was successful in writing a grant request through the Governor's Office of Economic Development's (GOED) Workforce Innovations for the New Nevada (WINN) program for \$337,641 to support the Mobile Manufacturing Unit. Because this was a state grant, it did not go through the WNC Foundation's books.

*Additionally, the WNC Foundation wrote a successful grant request through the Governor's Office of Economic Development for \$337,000 in support of the Mobile Manufacturing Unit within the Applied Industrial Technology Center. This grant does not flow through the WNC Foundation's financials.

Below: The mobile manufacturing unit was funded through nearly \$800,000 in grants provided by The William N. Pennington Foundation, Tesla, Wells Fargo and the Governor's Office of Economic Development. The unit arrived on campus in September of 2020 and will be in full operation serving WNC's rural service area beginning Spring of 2021.





WNC Foundation assisted Western Nevada College by securing funding to support the following capital projects throughout FY20

- ✓ WNC Foundation raised close to \$800,000 to build a mobile manufacturing Training Unit that will impact workforce development by training rural students on manufacturing practices. WNC secured grant funding from William N. Pennington Foundation, Tesla, Wells Fargo and WINN through the Governor's Office of Economic Development to support this innovative project.
- ✓ Renovations to the Biology Laboratory which was relocated to the Aspen Building began in FY19 and concluded in FY20. This \$1.35 million project was generously funded through the William N. Pennington Foundation and was completed under budget and on time. Remaining funds were approved for use in renovating the hallway space outside the laboratory.
- ✓ Following a recent survey to better understand student food and housing insecurity, WNC Foundation secured funding for a Food Pantry that will supply nonperishable toiletries and groceries to students in need. This initiative has been funded through a grant from NV Energy, a donation from Visiting Angels and a generous gift from WNC's campus police.

Financial Performance

The WNC Foundation assets totaled \$4,545,500 as of June 30, 2020. This compares to assets of \$5,201,499 one year prior. The 13% difference is primarily due to spending down of the \$1.3 million grant funding from the William N. Pennington Foundation for the renovation of the Biology Laboratory that was completed in January of 2020.



WNC Foundation was pleased to award our highest dollar amount of scholarships in the history of the foundation with a **29%** year-over-year increase for the 2018-2019 academic year.

- √ 348 scholarships were awarded to 248 students.
- √ \$200,000 in scholarship support was generously provided by the William N. Pennington Foundation for the benefit of students pursuing careers in technical education.
- ✓ Nursing scholarships grew to over \$190,000 in annual funding.
- ✓ The prison education program was supported with nearly \$30,000 in private funding for scholarships for incarcerated students.
- ✓ The Clarence and Martha Berger Trust Scholarship Endowment was created with a \$500,000 gift from the Berger family.
- ✓ The WNC Foundation projects that over \$600,000 in scholarships will be awarded for the 2019-2020 academic year.



FY20 Event Revenue: Reach for the Stars & Golf for Education



Over three-hundred and fifty (350) guests were invited to the 2020 annual "We Are Western" scholarship celebration. The event, scheduled for March 13th was canceled on March 11th due to measures taken to slow the spread of COVID-19.



The We Are Western magazine which accompanies the event, celebrates WNC donors' generosity and congratulates WNC student scholarship recipients.

The publication was distributed to students and donors via the mail and at the WNC's drive-through graduation. The magazine served as a safe way to recognize these accomplishments in lieu of an in-person event.

With the continued uncertainty around holding events, WNC Foundation plans to continue to publish the magazine into 2021 without the annual in-person event.

WNC Foundation held the first-ever It's a No Brainer Virtual Trivia Night with over 100 community members in attendance making up 30 competitive teams. The event's host and emcee for the evening was Vice Chancellor Nate Mackinnon. The event raised over \$3,000 for WNC's emergency student fund.



Drive Through Graduation


2020 marked the first year WNC held an outdoor, drive-through Graduation. The event was certainly unique and no less inspiring and heart-warming than a traditional graduation. Photos taken of graduates were sponsored by WNC Foundation board member, Ronele Dotson's company RAD strategies and a portion of the proceeds were donated to the student emergency fund within the WNC Foundation. WNC awarded 692 degrees and certificates to 650 students, 94 of these students were high school students earning their associates degrees before receiving their high school diplomas.


